





SOUTH ASIA REGIONAL INITIATIVE FOR ENERGY INTEGRATION (SARI/EI)









Purpose of the conference:

Access to reliable, affordable, and cleaner energy is a high priority to facilitate economic development and improved welfare of the population in South Asia Region. South Asian Countries have vast diversity of energy resources, which are still under development, particularly hydro power, and renewable energy. With rapidly rising demand across all the South Asian Countries (SAC) and limited supply, there are huge opportunities exists for the optimization of resources through interconnected power system for SAC. Presently around 2500 MW is being traded in South Asia Region and electricity trade is likely to be doubled by the end of year 2019-20. Increased energy/electricity cooperation among countries can bring economies of scale in investment, strengthen in electricity sector financing capability, enhance competition, and improve sector efficiency. Thus, there is a need for regional energy cooperation that offers an ideal platform for achieving sustainable growth through sharing of available natural energy resources in the South Asia Region and gradual positive progress is already taking place over the years.

IRADe is the implementing partner of USAID's flagship program, South Asian Regional Initiative for Energy Integration (SARI/EI) since 2012. The program aims to advance energy cooperation, regional energy integration and to promote/facilitate Cross Border Electricity Trade (CBET) in the eight South Asian countries (Afghanistan, Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Pakistan, Nepal, Sri Lanka and the Maldives). Under SARI/EI Program, IRADe has taken various initiatives/studies such as development of Regional Regulatory Guidelines, suggested changes/amendments in each country's laws/policies, economic benefits of power trade, harmonization of grid codes, operating procedures for integration of power system, model PPA and TSA, transmission pricing mechanism, regional investment framework, framework for open access and trading licenses, BIMSTEC energy outlook etc.

As the program has entered its final year and reaches its conclusions, we plan to hold SARI/EI Regional Conference on "Enhancing Energy Integration in South Asia" to discuss, deliberate and disseminate the key findings of SARI/EI Research studies to promote Cross Border Electricity Trade in the region and various activities carried out by SARI/EI/IRADe since 2012.

Background:

IRADe has been working in the South Asia Region to promote Energy Cooperation & Cross Border Electricity Trade since -October'2012, more than 5 and half years under the SARI/EI Program of the USAID. During these – years, we worked with South Asian Country Governments, Power Utilities, Power planning & regulating authorities such as CEA, CERC, NEA, BPDB, Private institutions, Regional Institutions such as SAARC & BIMSTEC, Think Tanks etc. and many others. Over the years we brought out a number of technical reports listed separately. They were released earlier by Shri Rajiv Kumar, Vice Chairman, NITI Aayog in New Delhi, Ambassador Manjeev Puri in Nepal, Dr. Swarnim Wagle, Member Energy, Nepal Planning Commission, Mr. Nasrul Hamid, State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resource, Bangladesh.


